  - II. Team Reports
    - A. Building/Facilities
      - 1. Building updates include insulating ductwork in basement, lighting and sound improvements for services, removing old HVAC from kitchen and installing donated range/stove.
      - 2. Weekly cleaning
      - 3. Grounds (incl Green Team) summary: mowing, watering, planting, etc. Food forest won \$500 grant from Wild Ones.

      - 1. Membership summary: 106 members, 64 friends. Average attendance table & graph.

      - 1. Sunday Services: Hybrid services continue most Sundays, many volunteers facilitate, host Zoom, do tech, etc. Annette summarized our services in past year, Sunday Services Team.

      - 1. Grateful to Alyssa for accepting RE teaching position. Again, many volunteers.
      - 2. BATS (Being A Teen): summary of their activities.
      - 3. Adult RE: 4 Chalice Circles. New circles starting in fall.
      - 4. Adult enrichment: book club, Moving in Spirit, craft group, UURP, geology tour, wildflower & bird walks.
    - E. Social Justice
      - 1. Summary of activities: Pride Fest, shelter meals, hygiene drive, partnership with Nicolet Elementary.
      - 2. JOSHUA affiliation: prison reform & housing initiatives.
      - 3. WUUSAN support
    - F. Post Consortium Planning Team
      - 1. Services: Zoom once per month to Open Circle, Carrie Arnold monthly, Rev Hannah &

Christina from FVUUF alternating once per month, once per month other speakers.

- 2. Rev Jim will still develop lesson plans for RE & BATS.
- 3. Adult Enrichment: similar offerings, volunteer led.
- 4. Board Guidance & assistance with discerning our future will be provided by Rev Hannah & Christina at FVUUF
- G. Stewardship Team: Roz summarized
  - 1. Canvass Results: \$73,462 pledged so far from 58 total pledge units. Average slightly lower than last year.
  - 2. Bank balance as of 5/21/2025
    - a) Checking: \$13k+
    - b) Reserve Fund: \$38,413 (with amounts allocated to large projects)
    - c) Mortgage Balance: \$163k at 4.45%
    - d) Quotes from last year for parking lot (\$42-47k). Looking for someone to manage the project.
  - 3. Proposed Budget
    - a) Income (projected): \$86,658
    - b) Expenses (projected): \$85,468
    - c) Net \$1190 (about breaking even)

  - B. Update definition of Lifetime Membership to remove language that limits reasons Board can nominate someone for this, and include rights of Active Voting Member.
    - 1. Discussion about creating temporary designations (eg, for hardship) rather than Lifetime. Board can also decide to waive contribution requirement for member, which essentially does allow for that.
    - 2. Jerri Fioramanti moved to approve, Steve Linden seconded. Motion passed 32 in favor, none opposed.
